## A Salute to Our WWII Generation: Let Us Not Forget

is a documentary film which seeks to honor the brave men and women who served during World War II, while also educating and inspiring future generations. As part of this tribute, a group of history students will embark on an educational journey to learn about the experiences and sacrifices of these veterans, bringing history to life in a way that textbooks alone cannot achieve.

The educational project will be overseen by a history teacher from the Plymouth Canton Community School district who will teach and inspire students as they create an honorary tribute of a WWII veteran (living or deceased). To broaden their perspective, we'd like to invite (and film) students on a field trip to one of the many historical locations, such as:



- Michigan Flight Museum at Willow Run Airport in Belleville: The students will visit the museum to learn about WWII aviation history.
- **The Michigan WWII Legacy Memorial in Royal Oak:** This visit will provide insight into the enduring legacy of the war and the memorials dedicated to those who served.
- **Great Lakes National Cemetery in Holly:** The students will be featured touring the cemetery so they understand the significance of military burial honors.
- Michigan Heroes Museum in Frankenmuth: This museum provides a shrine to the ordinary lives caught up in the extraordinary experience of war.

The journey will culminate in a powerful experience as students participate in the annual Plymouth Memorial Day Parade. Each student will carry an 11"x17" foam core image of the veteran they studied, honoring their legacy and sharing their stories with the community.

Producers Mark Salloum and Keith Famie aim to create a lasting tribute that will be integrated into Michigan's educational system. By documenting the students' reflections and insights throughout the film, this project will not only educate but also inspire future generations to appreciate the freedoms they enjoy today.

The initial meeting of the planning committee for this year's Memorial Day parade in Plymouth was held on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2025. We discussed your suggestion to have the local students who are involved in your documentary titled "A Salute To Our WWII Generation – Let Us. Not Forget" march in the parade carrying a photograph of the WWII veteran they research. It was also understood that your company would be video recording these students during the parade. The committee had no problem allowing these students to participate in the parade.

Plymouth's Memorial Day parade is meant to remember and honor the veterans who have died in active military service throughout this nation's history. Many have called those who served in WWII as the "greatest generation" because their service helped ensure an Allied victory for this devastating war. Your documentary, "A Salute To Our WWII Generation – Let Us Not Forget," helps to memorialize the personal stories of select WWII veterans. Having your students get involved in this documentary helps ensure that these veterans' sacrafices are not forgotten.

Individuals regularly provide privately-owned military vehicles for the parade. Although the type and quantity varies from year to year, the parade attendees all seem to enjoy seeing military-style vehicles in the parade procession. Since your documenatery is focused on WWII, if you are aware of anyone who could provide a WWII-era military vehicle for the parade, as well as any reenactors, it would be greatly appreciated. The parade route is just under one half mile, and it terminates at Plymouth's Veterans Memorial Park, at which time we conduct a short ceremony. If desired, we can attempt to arrange with the City of Plymouth to have these military vehicles parked near Veterans Park at the conclusion of the parade so they can be on display. Unfortunately, our planning committee does not have an operations budget, so the vehicles' owners would have to incur the cost of their operation, as well as insurance for their vehicles.

Producer/Director Mark Salloum has been producing short films and video content for nearly three decades. In 1997, he formed Highway Media to fulfill his passion and has since become one of the most awarded studios in Metro Detroit, traveling to 15 states and five countries for their clients. In 2019, Mark released his first feature length documentary, *Plymouth, Michigan – A Rich History*, which sold out 11 consecutive shows at the Penn Theatre.



By fate or chance, Mark and Keith met in 2024, to discuss their love for filmmaking and decided to collaborate their energy together. Their new studio, Bending River Films, will be the vehicle to produce documentary films which inspire, inform, and initiate their audiences like never before.



### Keith Famie Director/Producer/Author

Director/Producer Keith Famie was, for many years, known as a celebrity chef and a Metro Detroit restaurateur. Famie was also a finalist on the 2001 reality television series, "Survivor, the Australian Outback." Keith hosted his own Food Network series, "Keith Famie's Adventures," traveling the world documenting different cooking styles.

In 2004, Famie embarked on a new journey - documentary filmmaking. "I didn't want to be the 'Adventure Chef' guy anymore. I wanted to help people tell their stories."

Since that life-changing decision, Famie & his company, Visionalist Entertainment Productions, has been awarded twenty-three Michigan Emmys and been nominated several other times for his rich, human-interest storytelling, from a day in the life of children with Down syndrome to stories about Alzheimer's, cancer, healthy aging as well as Detroit's rich history told through documentaries such as **Detroit: The City of Churches**, **Detroit: The City of Chefs** and **Detroit: The City of Hot Rods & Muscle Cars**.
